Chairman Rick Kochel called to order the Earl Township Board of Supervisors meeting, held on **Thursday November 5, 2020**, at 7:00 a.m. The following were present: Supervisors Rick Kochel, Ray Martin and Tom Plitt and Lee Zimmerman, Road Master.

Tom made a motion to approve the time extension for the Lanco Sheds, Lot 9, 271 Commerce Drive, New Holland, Preliminary/Final Land Disturbance Plan, to meet the conditions to record the Plan. Ray seconded the motion and all voted yes. The Plan will now expire on January 4, 2021.

Ray made a motion to approve the time extension for the Stump's Quality Decks, 2458-2482 Division Highway, Ephrata, Final Land Disturbance Plan, to meet the conditions to record the Plan. Rick seconded the motion and all voted yes. The Plan will now expire on March 1, 2021.

Tom made a motion to approve the pick-up truck purchase and trade-in program using a three (3) to five (5) year turnover option using Liquid Fuels funds. Two (2) new pick-up trucks will be purchased in 2021, which will replace the 2003 and 2018 pick-up trucks. Ray seconded the motion and all voted yes. This will generate a cost savings, due to the trade-in will pay for most of the new purchases.

Rick reported that he attended the October 29, 2020 Lancaster County Planning Commission's meeting on the Places2040 Implementation Workshop, the urban side of Growing Responsibly buildable lands, redevelopment and infill, and Urban Growth Area boundaries. And that the Amish are buying residential properties and wanting to have horses and carriage barns.

The proposed 2021 Liquid Fuels budget was review and discussed.
